




Did you know !



THE PONY EXPRESS

The Pony Express was a system that delivered mail on horseback between Missouri and California. The service lasted for only about a year and a half in the early 1860s. The Pony Express was a system of U.S. mail delivery made by horse -and-rider relays that took place from April 1860 to October 1861. Over 100 stations, 400-500 horses and enough riders were needed - at an estimated cost of \$70,000. But on April 3, 1860, the first official delivery began at the eastern terminus of the Pony Express in St. Joseph, Missouri. Close to midnight on April 14, 1860, the mail reached its destination in San Francisco.

* The oldest chinchilla ever was Radar (born February 1st, 1985 in Germany), who was owned by Christina Anthony. Radar was 29 years 229 days old when he died in Acton, California, USA on September 18th 2014, Radar was born in Germany but moved with his owner Christina, to America in 2002.

*The tallest living horse is Big Jake, a nine-year-old Belgian Gelding horse, who measured 20 hands 2.75 in (210.19 cm, 82.75 in), without shoes, at Smokey Hollow Farms in Poynette, Wisconsin, USA, on 19 January 2010.

*The longest jump by a guinea pig was achieved by Truffles (UK), who cleared a gap of 48 cm (18.89 in) in Rosyth, Fife, UK, on 6th April 2012. 



Montauciel the sheep was one of the world's first aeronauts





Long before Sputnik, Laika the Soviet space dog, and even the Wright brothers, there was Montauciel the sheep and his fowl companions. In the 1700s, people wanted to test to see if humans could withstand time spent at high altitudes. There had already been several unmanned hot air balloon flights, and in 1783, the first flight containing a land animal took off. Montauciel the sheep went up in the balloon, accompanied by a duck (a bird already used to high altitudes) and a rooster (a flightless bird).

The balloon was called the Aérostat Réveillon, and was flown by the Montgolfier brothers on September 19, 1783, at Versailles before King Louis XVI and Queen Marie Antoinette. The flight lasted about eight minutes, reaching an altitude of 1,500 feet (460 meters) and covering two miles (3 km).

The Montgolfier brothers believed that if a sheep could survive the trip, so could a human. The animals all returned unharmed...mostly. Montauciel apparently kicked the rooster before the balloon took off, the big bully, but not enough to harm it. (Fun fact: Montauciel's name means "ascend into the sky" in French.)

How to Help Prevent Foxtail Problems


- Avoid foxtail-infested areas in "foxtail season" from early summer, when foxtails and surrounding grasses start to dry, until the fall or winter wet season eliminates the foxtail threat.
- ▶ If you must walk your dog in areas where foxtails grow, keep him on leash and on the trail to help reduce his chances of encountering the awns.
- ➤ To keep your dog from inhaling or ingesting a foxtail awn, don't allow him to play fetch anywhere near foxtails. Don't allow hunting or tracking dogs to sniff around foxtails.
- ▶ If you have foxtails in your yard, keep the plants mowed while they are still green to help prevent them from going to seed. Better yet, pull the grasses up by hand and deposit the whole plants directly into a garbage bag or compost bin.
- ▶ If your dog is long-haired, trim all the hair between his toes, over the top of his toes and feet, from his legs, around his ears, his vent, and his belly. Short hair helps deny the foxtails the resistance they need to migrate deeper into the dog's skin.
- ► Keep your dog well groomed. Foxtails readily work their way into mats, but can be easily brushed out of a

clean, untangled coat.

- Most importantly, after every outdoor experience in a foxtail zone, check your dog from head to toe. Examine the space between each and every toe and underneath his feet. Look in his armpits, groin, anal area, and ears.
- ► Keep alert for suspicious lumps, bumps, or swellings on your dog. Look for limping or excessive licking of toes, head-shaking, sneezing, or a glued-shut eye.
- ► If your dog exhibits any of the symptoms of having a foxtail (see sidebar, previous page), take him to a veterinarian as soon as possible that day!

FUN FACTS

*A dog's sense of smell is so precise, it could detect a teaspoon of sugar in a million gallons of water, or two Olympic-sized pools worth.

*When dogs kick backward after they go to the bathroom it's not to cover it up, but to mark their territory, using the scent glands in their feet.

*Dogs rely on panting to regulate their body temperature, which is a more efficient way for them to cool down than sweating through their fur.

When it slams its beak into a tree in search of grubs, a woodpecker experiences G-forces twenty times what would likely lead to traumatic brain injuries in humans. And it does it 12,000 times a day, day after day, without as much as a headache. It survives the experience with its marbles intact because of remarkable tongue, which works as a safety belt for the braincase. Other features of the skull that prevent damage brain include shock absorbers at the base of the beak that cushion the brain from the impact forces.

*A young, healthy, average-sized cat can jump about six times their length or over eight feet in a single bound. Cats are able to rotate their supple spines more than many other animals and can twist their bodies to a much greater extent.

*In case you hadn't noticed, cats have a unique way of walking: They move both front paws together, then both back paws, similar to camels and giraffes.

Emperor penguins can dive to of hundreds depths of metres. Penguins are able to dive deep because of unique adaptions to their cardiovascular system. As they prepare to dive their heart starts to race and the penguin hyperventilates, which primes its muscles with oxygen. Then it dives in and something, well, breathtaking: it cuts off the blood supply to its muscles to conserve dissolved oxygen for the rest of its body.

Taking Your Dog To The Beach Rules and Etiquette You Should Follow

Do you have plans to go to the beach with your dog this summer? Not all beaches allow dogs – partly because some dog owners have disregarded public laws in the past and made it difficult for the rest of us that do follow the rules. When you do find dog-friendly beaches, it's even more important than ever to exhibit good K9 Etiquette!

Check In Advance

Prior to arriving at your beach destination, with your dog in tow, check with the city, municipality or state park to determine if your pet is allowed on the beach. During peak tourist season, typically May-September, there is a greater likelihood that dogs will not be welcome on the beach or may be subjected to restricted hours (so check with your local beach listings first).

Comply with Leash Laws at Dog Friendly Beaches

Allowing your dog to roam free on the beach can be dangerous to both your pet and other occupants. By keeping your pet on a leash at all times, you ensure that your pet is under control, out of harms way, unable to bother other beach goers or have an altercation with another dog.

In many cases, *leash laws can regulate the lengths of leashes to 6 or 8 feet*. In that case, your pet may not be able to run at the end of a retractable.

Be aware of all leash laws as most are coupled with a monetary fine for those choosing to disregard this common sense, and common courtesy, rule.

Pack Prepared

Your dog has needs at the beach just as they do at home. To ensure your dog has as great a time as you do, pack:

- * extra water
- * plastic reusable water bowl
- * clean up bags and/or pooper scooper
- * life vest or preserver
- * first aid kit
- * waterproof leash and collar,

Training for Good Measure

Teach your pet to recall, or to come on command so that you can have verbal control over if and when he is off-leash.

Taking Care of the Environment

Environmentalists, state and local agencies are concerned with the preservation of wildlife that nests and plants that are grown on the coastal shore. Be sure your dog does not disturb nests or destroy area wildlife in their quest for enjoyment.

Please Pick-Up after Your Pet

Dog waste on the beach can ruin any beach lover's day. One of the main reasons pets have been prohibited at the beach is because of the waste their owners choose to leave behind, polluting the sand and surf. Be respectful of the beach and its patrons, pick up and dispose of all dog waste in appropriate receptacles. This does not necessarily include the garbage cans of a homeowner that lives on the shoreline. Use public access waste facilities or take dog waste with you for disposal.

Quick Rinse

Being itchy and irritated isn't fun for anyone, this includes your pet. After a day at the beach rinse your pooch off with water at a convenient beachside shower to remove sand, salt and small beach bugs. This will keep your dog comfortable for the rest of the day, along with keeping your car/home almost sand-free!

At Purrrlandia, we're on a mission to rescue, rehabilitate, and rehome adoptable cats while fostering responsible guardianship and compassionate cat care. More than just a cafe, we are a bridge between at-risk cats and loving homes.

Through free-roaming socialization, education, and adoption support, we help reduce shelter overcrowding, lower euthanasia risk, and give every rescue cat the second chance they deserve. Whether you're here to adopt, unwind with a cup of coffee, or simply enjoy the company of our feline residents, every visit makes a difference.

A Vision Inspired by Rescue Cats

Purrrlandia was born from a simple yet powerful belief: every cat deserves a chance to thrive in a space that honors their nature and connects them with loving humans.

Founder and CEO Kat Killoran discovered this firsthand while volunteering at her local animal shelter. Many cats—especially the shy, fearful ones—were overlooked, unable to engage in their natural instincts or express their true personalities in the stress of a kennel. Without meaningful interaction, adopters often felt disheartened, and some well-intentioned adopters lacked the education needed to set their new cats up for success. This sometimes led to misunderstandings, adoption returns, and increased strain on both the cats and the shelter system.

For many shelters, limited space, behavioral challenges, and treatable health conditions can put even highly adoptable cats at risk of euthanasia. The shelter environment itself often exacerbates these issues, as stress can lead to illness or fear-based behaviors that make cats seem "unfriendly" or "unadoptable."

Inspired by her travels to Japan's cat cafes, Kat envisioned a different kind of space—one where rescue, relaxation, and human connection could coexist. A sanctuary where adoptable rescue cats could roam freely, engage in natural behaviors, and form genuine bonds with guests looking to provide them a forever home.

And so, Purrrlandia was born—not just as a cafe, but as a life-changing experience for both cats and the people who love them.

Be Ready

Pets are part of the family and deserve to be cared for in the same manner. It's important to make sure that your pets are considered in your family emergency plan. If you need to evacuate your home, do not leave your animals behind.



- ✓ Consider microchipping your pet
- ✓ Make a list of which hotels along your evacuation route allow animals.
- Gather contact information for area shelters and veterinary hospitals
- ✓ Make sure ID tags are fastened to their collar
- ✓ Determine a family member, friend or neighbor who is nearby and would be willing to take the animal with them in the event that you're unable to make it home

Create a pet emergency kit that includes:


- ✓ Food and water for at least 3 days
- ✓ Medicines and a list of medical conditions
- Important documents, such as vaccination records
- Leashes and harnesses, and cages or crates
- ✓ First aid kit
- Current photo of animal for identification purposes
- Sanitation items





World famous Spanish artist, Pablo Picasso was a known animal lover and had many pets throughout his life, including cats, dogs, and even a goat. He was particularly fond of a dachshund named Lump, who had free reign of his studio and even ate from his plate. Other notable pets included Afghan hounds like Kaboul and a Dalmatian named Perro.



Here's a more detailed look at some of Picasso's pets:

<u>Lump</u>: A dachshund who became one of Picasso's most beloved pets and a muse for several of his works. Lump was originally owned by Picasso's friend, photographer David Douglas Duncan, but Picasso and Lump became inseparable.
