*Spectacled Owls can live up to 35 years in the wild and 25-30 years in captivity. While they have few predators in the wild, factors like habitat loss and potential injuries while hunting can affect their lifespan.

*Some species of parrots have been known to live more than 100 years. Cockatoos aren't far behind, sometimes living as long as 75 years.

*The largest known bird's nest was built by a pair of bald eagles near St Petersburg, Florida, USA and measured 2.9 m (9 ft 6 in) wide and 6 m (20 ft) deep. It was examined in 1963 and was estimated to weigh more than 2 tons (4,409 lb).

*The color of a swan's beak varies depending on the species. Mute Swans have orange beaks, while Black Swans have red beaks. Whooper and Trumpeter Swans typically have black beaks.

*The dove is any of certain birds of the pigeon family, Columbidae. The names pigeon and dove are often used interchangeably. Although dove usually refers to the smaller, long-tailed members of the pigeon family, there are exceptions: the domestic pigeon, a rather typical pigeon, is frequently called the rock dove and is the bird portrayed as and called the "dove of peace."

Michael Jackson's chimpanzee, Bubbles, is still alive and well, living at the Center for Great Apes in Florida. He's now 42 years old and lives in a sanctuary with other chimpanzees, enjoying activities like painting and spending time with friends. Bubbles became famous in the 1980s as Michael Jackson's companion, appearing in music videos, on tour, and in photoshoots.

Brief History of the Western Riding Saddle

Early day horsemen rode bareback. From traveling to waging war, for hundreds of years, man rode without a saddle.

The first saddle is believed to have been invented in 365 AD by the Sarmations. Proud horsemen who used their horses in battle and also sacrificed them to the gods, their saddle creations were brought back to Europe by the Huns. Finding the metal stirrups great for mounting, as well as for increasing overall balance, the Europeans discovered that they were able to wield war weapons with more skill and accuracy.

In the beginning, leather tanning was undeveloped, at best. As the years passed, saddlers perfected the process, resulting in soft, supple, durable hides. The saddle's tree, generally made from a carved piece of wood, evolved into wood covered rawhide, fiberglass, carbon fiber, and, most recently, a complete removal of the tree.

The western saddle we know today is an evolved version of the Spanish Vaquero's working saddle. As the working cowboys used their saddles, they underwent a gradual change in order to continue to meet the demands of life in the Old West. Specialized jobs, such as roping cattle, resulted in specialized saddle types.

Then came the invention of rodeos. Initially intended for working cowboys to showcase their skills, the introduction of individualized events led to the evolution of more saddle types, from barrel to roping models.

As riders' demands changed from working to pleasure, and chosen mounts continue to evolve, the saddle has advanced, as well. One only has to look as far as a retail catalog or website to see the dizzying array of models available today.

Police Horses Have Been Around Since the 17th Century

Police horses have been used as a peaceful method of maintaining law and order since the 17th century. They are still used by many police forces but are not as widespread as in the past due to the increased use of police cars and motorbikes. However, a mounted officer is still a common sight in many parts of the world and is useful, particularly in crowded areas: generally mounted police officers can see for a long distance and can easily be seen by others. They also help to maintain order as they command respect and a sense of authority. The horses that are used for this job tend to be castrated as this makes them more peaceful.

Several animals are commonly associated with autumn, which includes squirrels, deer, and migrating birds. For 15 years, Shelter Hope has been serving the Conejo Valley community - and beyond - by rescuing unwanted pets that often end up on the streets. We were founded out of a desperate need to lower euthanasia rates in California's overcrowded government shelters.

As we grew, we recognized how vital public education was to our mission. Informing people about the realities of rescue became just as important as the rescue work itself.

We've built strong partnerships with local vets, groomers, and doggy daycares, creating a sustainable, nonprofit model that other rescues can follow—one that operates with transparency, community support, and compassion.

Media outlets like KTLA, The Petz Gazette, and The Beverly Hills Courier have helped keep animal welfare in the public eye, and we're grateful for their continued support.

Why are we called "Shelter Hope Pet Shop"?

It's one of the most common questions we get. The answer: After years of protesting puppy mill pet shops in malls, I realized the best way to make change was to open a pet shop myself—one that only featured rescue dogs. We kept "pet shop" in the name so we'd appear in online searches, but we've never sold pet products. Instead, we send each adopter home with a package of goodies to help them get started.

Our Adoption Philosophy

We haven't raised our adoption fees in years, and we adjust each fee based on the dog—not their breed or looks, but their needs. To us, every dog is priceless.

People often ask:

"Why so many Chihuahuas?"

"Why so many senior dogs?"

"Why don't you have what I want?"

After 30 years in rescue, I've learned that what people want in a pet isn't always what they need. Let us help guide you to the dog that truly fits your life and home.

Education & Advocacy

On our Instagram and through community outreach, we raise awareness about pressing issues in the rescue world—like the rise of fake rescues posing as nonprofits while buying puppies from backyard breeders.

A Vision Inspired by Rescue Cats

Purrrlandia was born from a simple yet powerful belief: every cat deserves a chance to thrive in a space that honors their nature and connects them with loving humans.

Founder and CEO Kat Killoran discovered this firsthand while volunteering at her local animal shelter. Many cats—especially the shy, fearful ones—were overlooked, unable to engage in their natural instincts or express their true personalities in the stress of a kennel. Without meaningful interaction, adopters often felt disheartened, and some well-intentioned adopters lacked the education needed to set their new cats up for success. This sometimes led to misunderstandings, adoption returns, and increased strain on both the cats and the shelter system.

For many shelters, limited space, behavioral challenges, and treatable health conditions can put even highly adoptable cats at risk of euthanasia. The shelter environment itself often exacerbates these issues, as stress can lead to illness or fear-based behaviors that make cats seem "unfriendly" or "unadoptable."

Inspired by her travels to Japan's cat cafes, Kat envisioned a different kind of space—one where rescue, relaxation, and human connection could coexist. A sanctuary where adoptable rescue cats could roam freely, engage in natural behaviors, and form genuine bonds with guests looking to provide them a forever home.

And so, Purrrlandia was born—not just as a cafe, but as a life-changing experience for both cats and the people who love them.



Sigmund Freud's Dogs

Sigmund Freud's dog, a Chow Chow named Jofi (also known as Yofi), played a significant role in his life and





work. She was present during his therapy sessions and is considered an early example of animal-assisted therapy. Jofi's presence was believed to have a calming effect on his patients and Freud even used her to gauge their emotional state.

Freud observed that Jofi could sense a patient's emotional state and would position herself accordingly, sitting closer to those who seemed depressed and further from those who appeared anxious. Freud reportedly relied on Jofi's reactions to patients as a way to assess their mental state, viewing her as a reliable judge of character. Jofi was also known to be a surprisingly accurate timekeeper, yawning and leaving the room at the end of the 50-minute session.

Freud had other Chow Chows, including Lun-Yu and Lün, and his daughter Anna Freud also owned a Chow named Jofi II.
