The first U.S. company to use Santa Claus in advertising was White Rock Water in 1915, which included Santa in an advertisement for the first time, depicting him with a sleigh full of toys and White Rock water bottles. But Coca-Cola was the first company to create a cohesive and enduring marketing campaign featuring Santa Claus, starting with a department store in 1930 and then popularizing the modern image of Santa with artist Haddon Sundblom in 1931.

Did you know . . . !
June 26, 1870 was when Christmas became a Federal holiday. At first, Christmas was only applicable to Federal employees in the District of Columbia. It wasn't until 1885 that Congress extended the Christmas holiday to the Federal employees outside the DC area.

- *During the Christmas holiday season, more than 1.76 billion candy canes will be made.

CHRISTMAS TRIVIA

*Hallmark introduced its first Christmas cards in 1915, five years after the founding of the company.

*The first Christmas cards created in England were commissioned by Sir Henry Cole and illustrated by John Callcott Horsley in London on 1st May 1843.

*The first Christmas Day message by a British Monarch was in 1932, when King George V broadcast live from Sandringham. In the speech, which was written by Rudyard Kipling, the King celebrated the power of the wireless to unite all the people of the Empire, and wished them a Happy Christmas.

*The poinsettia is a traditional Christmas flower. In Mexico, the poinsettia is known as the "Flower of the Holy Night". It was brought to America by the diplomat Joel Poinsett in 1829.

Candy can also be traced back as far as 2000 BC to ancient Egypt and it could be said that Egyptians were the first people who made candy. It was also used in ceremonies for worshipping their gods and goddesses. The Egyptians used honey to make candy by adding figs, nuts, dates and spices.

The smell of cinnamon at this time of year means Christmas cookies are in the oven. If there's one spice that nearly everyone has in their kitchen it's cinnamon. Cinnamon, from the bark of a tree, is one of the oldest known spices. Arab traders brought it from China in 1700 B.C. 





The robin redbreast bird has been appearing on our Christmas cards since the practice of sending cards began in the mid-Nineteenth Century. In those days postmen wore red coats and were nicknamed 'Robins' or 'Redbreasts' so this jolly-looking bird became forever synonymous with festive greetings.



European Robin redbreasts live in various habitats, including forests, farmlands, and urban areas, often preferring open lawns with nearby trees for nesting. Their diet consists mainly of earthworms and insects in the morning, supplemented with fruits and berries in the afternoon and evening. They also eat other small invertebrates and sometimes even small amphibians, fish, or shellfish.

Did you know . . . !

*The iconic Christmas tree has a lot of roots (forgive the pun). Ancient Egyptians used to mark the winter solstice by decorating their homes with green palms, while the Romans celebrated Saturnalia with evergreen boughs. These green plants signified that the spring would return with new life. The first Christmas trees as we know them today started in Germany in the 16th century.

*The original Santa Claus was actually St. Nicholas, a Christian bishop in the 4th century. He didn't wear the red suit that's so famous today, but he did give all of his inheritance to the poor and needy. In Holland, his name is Sinter Klaas, which later morphed into Santa Claus.

*Eggnog originated in medieval Britain as a medieval posset, a warm, milky drink with ale or wine and spices. It became more accessible in the American colonies, where rum was commonly used instead of more expensive sherry. Over time, it evolved into a holiday staple, with regional variations and a potent history that includes being served by George Washington and causing the West Point Eggnog Riot of 1826.

*During World War II, the United States Playing Card Company joined forces with American and British intelligence agencies to create a very special deck of cards. They distributed them as Christmas gifts to soldiers, but they also helped Allied prisoners of war escape from German POW camps. When wet, individual cards peeled apart to reveal maps of escape routes.
