Annie Oakley

In the 1950s television series Annie Oakley, the famous female sharpshooter (played by Gail Davis) rode a white horse named Target. DOGS:

Did you know . . . !

Deep sea divers exploring an underwater cave near Marseilles, France, in 1991 were surprised to discover prehistoric wall murals with drawings of humans and animals; but were astounded when they found depictions of Penguins!

World Records

*The world record for the highest jump cleared by a dog is 172.7 cm (68 inches), achieved by 'Cinderella May A Holly Grey', owned by Kate Long and Kathleen Conroy of Miami, Florida, USA, at the Purina Incredible Dog Challenge National Finals, Gray Summit, Missouri, on October 7th, 2006.

*Didga, a talented rescue cat trained by Robert Dollwet in Australia, set the 2017 Guinness World Record for "Most Tricks Performed by a Cat in One Minute" by completing 20 (and later 24) tricks, including riding a skateboard, jumping, and high-fiving. She gained fame for her remarkable agility, intelligence, and her ability to perform complex tricks on a skateboard.

CAT TRIVIA

*When using a scratching post, cats aren't really "sharpening" their claws—they use them as a way to stretch.

*Calico and tortoiseshell cats are almost always female. It's all down to the X chromosome, which is where coat color genes are carried. Only female cats (with two X chromosomes) can display both orange and black patches.

*Cats were essential on ships (including Viking ships and colonial vessels) to prevent rodents from eating food supplies and spreading disease. Cats also helped control the London plague (and the wider Black Death) by preying on rats, which carried the plague-infected fleas.

*Pablo Picasso had several feline friends throughout his life, including a Siamese named Minou. Picasso even wandered the streets of Paris at night, scavenging food for his strays during tough times.

Did you know . . . !

The sea otter (*Enhydra lutris*) is the hairiest animal in the world, possessing the densest fur of any mammal. They have between 500,000 and 1,000,000 hairs per square inch (roughly 100,000–160,000 per cm²) to stay warm in cold water, as they lack blubber. A single otter can have over a billion hairs in total.

Purring is part of every cat's repertoire of social communication, apparently created by the movement of air in spasms through contractions of the diaphragm. Interestingly, purring is sometimes heard in cats who are severely ill or anxious, perhaps as a self-comforting vocalization. But, more typically, it is a sign of contentment, first heard in kittens as they suckle milk from their mother.

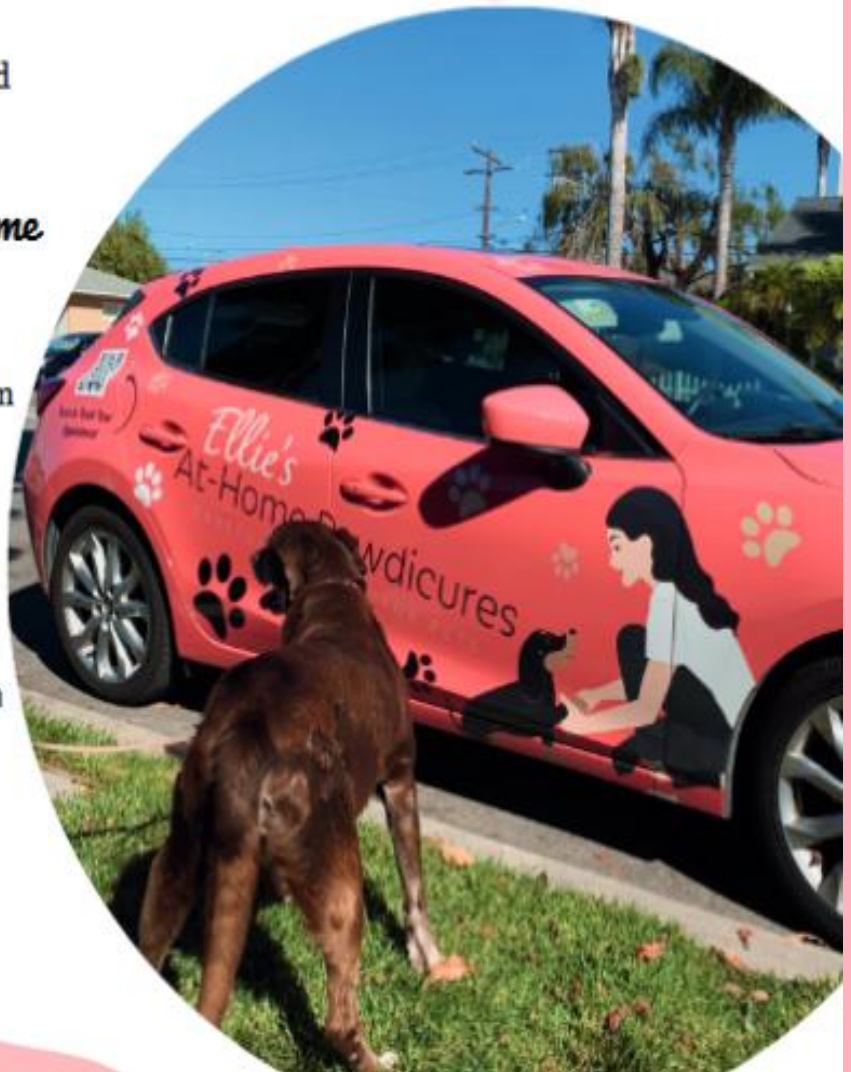



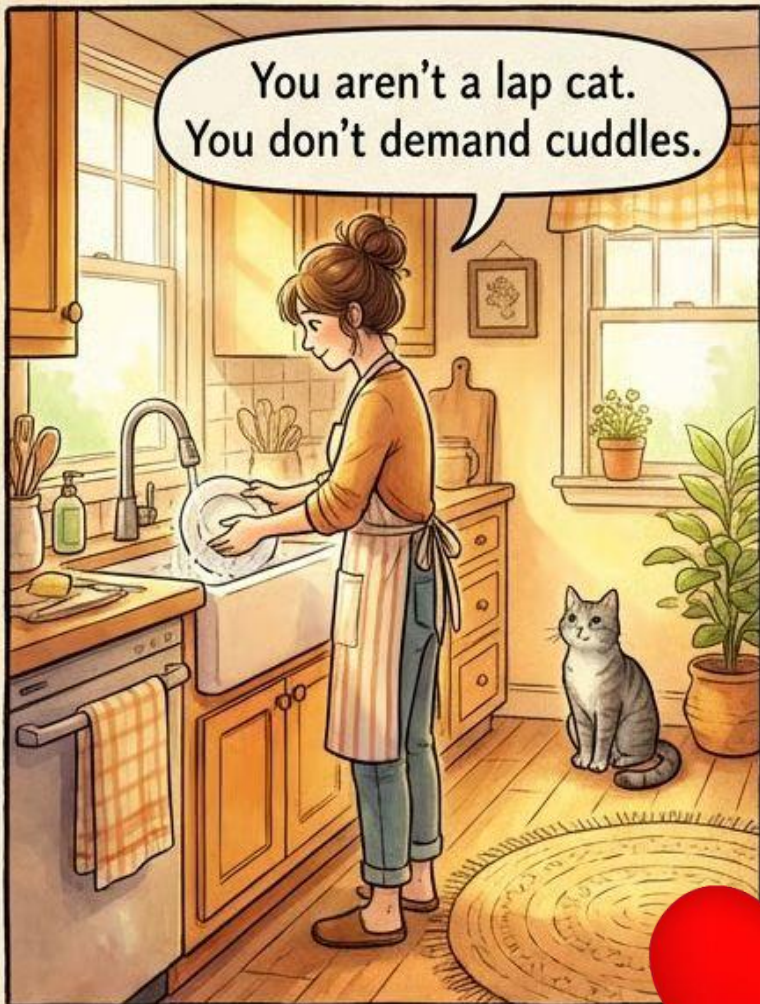


Fun Facts for the month of May

- **May** is the month of Mother's Day, Memorial Day, and all sorts of other fun designated days of celebrations and events.
- **May** is the fifth month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian calendars.
- The name **May** is the modern-day English adaption of the Latin word *Maius*, which has origins going back to the time of the ancient Greeks. They named the month of May (or Maius) after the Greek goddess of growth.
- The word **May** wasn't actually used until the middle ages were on their way out, around the 15th Century AD. Up until then, the Roman word Maius was still used.
- **May** used to have a very different name in Old English. Back then, the month was referred to as the "month of three milkings." Unsurprisingly, this meant that during this month, you could milk your cows up to three times per day! (*which might have been tough on both the poor cows and farmers!*).
- **May** was once considered an incredibly ill-omened time to get married. 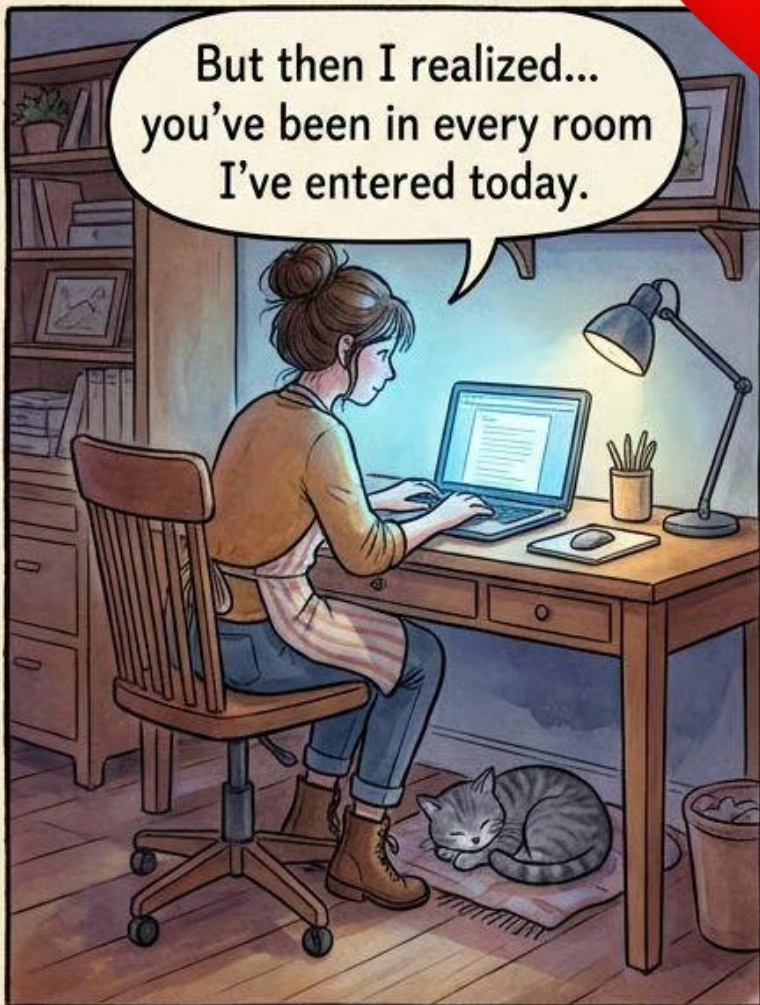

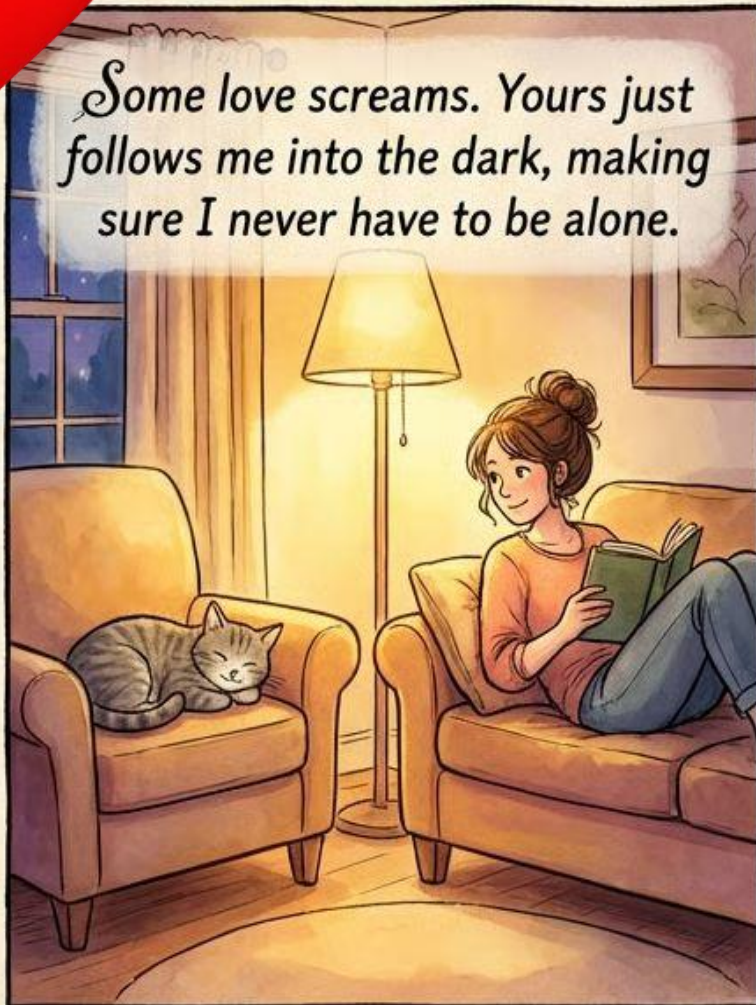

- Loans from the Four-Legged Fund may not be used for cat declawing or dog de-barking procedures.

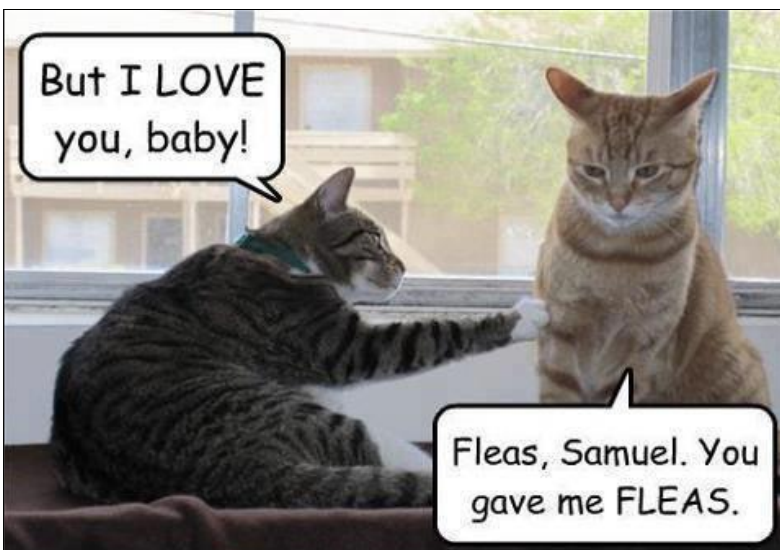
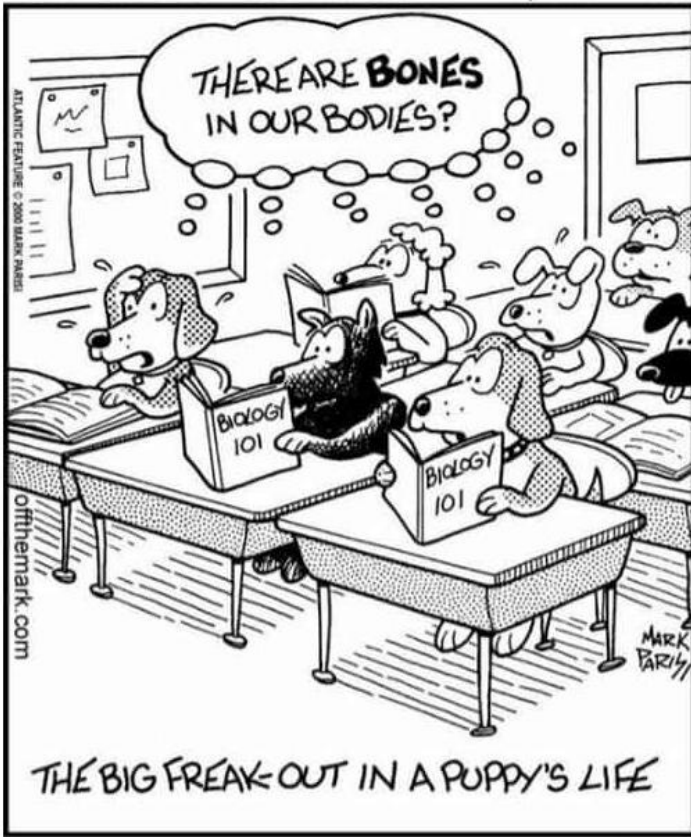

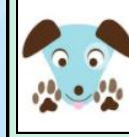

Sarcophagus of Prince Thutmose's Cat Ta Miu

Prince Thutmose is best remembered for the limestone sarcophagus of his beloved cat, Ta-miu (she-cat). The body of this sarcophagus is completely decorated with scenes, while the lid is inscribed with hieroglyphs. It shows the cat sitting before an offering table heaped with goodies for the afterlife.

It seems that her owner, Crown Prince Thutmose, wanted her to enjoy her time after death as much as she had appreciated being a cosseted royal pet in life. The back of the sarcophagus shows a cat at a table laden with offerings and a lotus flower, the sign of resurrection and rebirth.

Little is known about how Ta-Miu met her end, but after her death, she was mummified. Her sarcophagus tells us most of what we know about the short life of Crown Prince Thutmose.

The sides of the sarcophagus are decorated with scenes of the goddess Isis kneeling on a stool in the shape of the Nebu or gold symbol in hieroglyphs. On the left, a god holds two Nu jars for pouring libations.

There are two reasons to mummify a cat, the first of these is to provide a pet with a caring burial (like Ta-miu), and the second, more common reason is for ritual purposes.

The front of the sarcophagus depicts a large cat standing in front of a table heaped with different kinds of offerings including bread, beer, beheaded geese, and the foreleg of an ox. Behind the cat stands the cat goddess Bastet, completely wrapped.

The prince who loved his cat

Ancient Egyptians were serious cat people, they often buried with mummified animals and animal statues. It was seen as a way for the dead to bring pets with them to the afterlife.

Djhotmose (Thutmose) was so fond of his cat Ta-miu (she-cat) that he had a fine limestone sarcophagus carved for her, had her body mummified and then carefully buried.

Crown Prince Thutmose, was the eldest son of Amenhotep III and Queen Tiye. He was designated as king Amenhotep III's successor but pre-deceased his father. His younger brother, Amenhotep IV or Akhenaten, assumed the throne instead.

Cats played an important role in Egyptian religion. They were also household pets and could be valuable in controlling snakes and rodents.

The ancient Egyptians were drawn to felines' hunting prowess and their ability to protect their young. Egyptians believed cats were magical creatures, capable of bringing good luck to the people who housed them.

To honor these treasured pets, wealthy families dressed them in jewels and fed them treats fit for royalty. A number of animals including cats were mummified to serve as ritual offerings to the gods. Cats were often offered to the cat goddess Bastet as votives, with the practice of mummifying animals peaking in the 1st Millennium BC.

Votives in ancient Egyptian culture were items gifted to gods within temples to secure divine favor, express gratitude, or make personal requests. Huge numbers of animals were often stored en-mass in underground galleries. As this was done on such a large scale, most of the mummified cats which were offered as votives were kittens, this was so that the temple could continue to produce these votives without spending unnecessary time raising an adult cat.

Not to confuse which Thutmose is which:

Reign and Timeline

1. **Thutmose III:** Ruled for roughly 54 years (1479–1425 BC), initially co-ruling with Hatshepsut.
2. **Crown Prince Thutmose** (which is the above storyline): Lived during the reign of his father, Amenhotep III (18th Dynasty, c.1360s BC), dying well over a century after Thutmose III's death.
