- Routine care such as checkups, vaccinations, and dental cleanings
- Preventative treatments including flea, tick, and heartworm medication
- Unexpected emergencies like injuries, illnesses, hospitalization, or surgery
- Loans from the Four-Legged Fund may not be used for cat declawing or dog de-barking procedures.

Wall Street's Charging Bull

The Charging Bull bronze sculpture was created by Sicilian artist Arturo Di Modica. On December 14, 1989 Di Modica arrived on Wall Street with Charging Bull on the back of a truck and illegally dropped the sculpture outside of the New York Stock Exchange. The sculpture was conceived in the wake of the 1987 Black Monday stock market crash. Having arrived penniless in the USA in 1970, Di Modica felt indebted to America for welcoming him and enabling his career as a successful sculptor. Charging Bull was his gift back to America and intended to inspire each person who came into contact with it to carry on fighting through the hard times after the market crash for a brighter future.

Did you know.....,

Cats have amazing hearing ability. A cat's ear has 30 muscles that control the outer ear (by comparison, human ears only have six muscles). Whale protects scientist from shark

Marine biologist Nan Hauser experienced this phenomenon in 2017 off Rarotonga in the Cook Islands. While she was in the water, a massive humpback whale unexpectedly nuzzled her, tucked her under its pectoral fin, and lifted her out of the water, shielding her from a 15-foot tiger shark.

The Incredible Encounter

In September 2017, whale researcher Nan Hauser was filming underwater when a large humpback whale suddenly approached her and pushed her through the water. For over 10 minutes, the whale nudged her, lifted her on its flipper, and kept her tucked beneath its pectoral fin - a protective behavior these whales typically use to shield their calves. Unbeknownst to Hauser at first, a massive 15-foot tiger shark was swimming nearby. She later realized the whale had been actively shielding her from the shark and guiding her back to the safety of her boat.

The Scientific Perspective

While this event is a remarkable example of inter-species altruism, it sparked some scientific debate. Some researchers suggest that whales may be inherently programmed to protect other species, while others note it's difficult to know a whale's exact motivation without more data. Regardless of the specific scientific reasons, Hauser believes the whale intentionally saved her life and has since become a vocal advocate for the intelligence and empathy of these massive marine mammals.

4th July Fun Facts

- *Americans eat an estimated 150 million hot dogs on Independence Day alone. That's enough to stretch from Washington, D.C., to Los Angeles five times over.
- *Despite the holiday's age, Congress didn't make the 4th of July an official unpaid Federal holiday until 1870, and it wasn't made a paid holiday until 1938.

The old expression "**blind as a bat**" means having very poor eyesight, being completely unable to see, or failing to notice things happening right in front of you. The origin of the phrase is based on the old misconception that bats cannot see because they fly erratically and rely on echolocation to hunt in the dark. However, scientific consensus confirms that bats are not actually blind. They possess functional eyes, and many species have excellent night vision that is superior to human eyesight in low-light conditions.

What to Do in an Emergency

If you see an animal in distress inside a hot vehicle, take action immediately:

Note the Details: Write down the vehicle's make, model, color, and license plate number.

Find the Owner: If you are near a store, ask management to page the license plate over the intercom.

Call for Help: Immediately call local law enforcement (such as the Ventura County Sheriff's Dept) or animal control. In California, trained emergency responders can legally remove an animal from a vehicle to protect its health and safety.

At It's Heart: Cali Comes Homes is about...

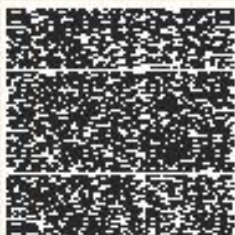

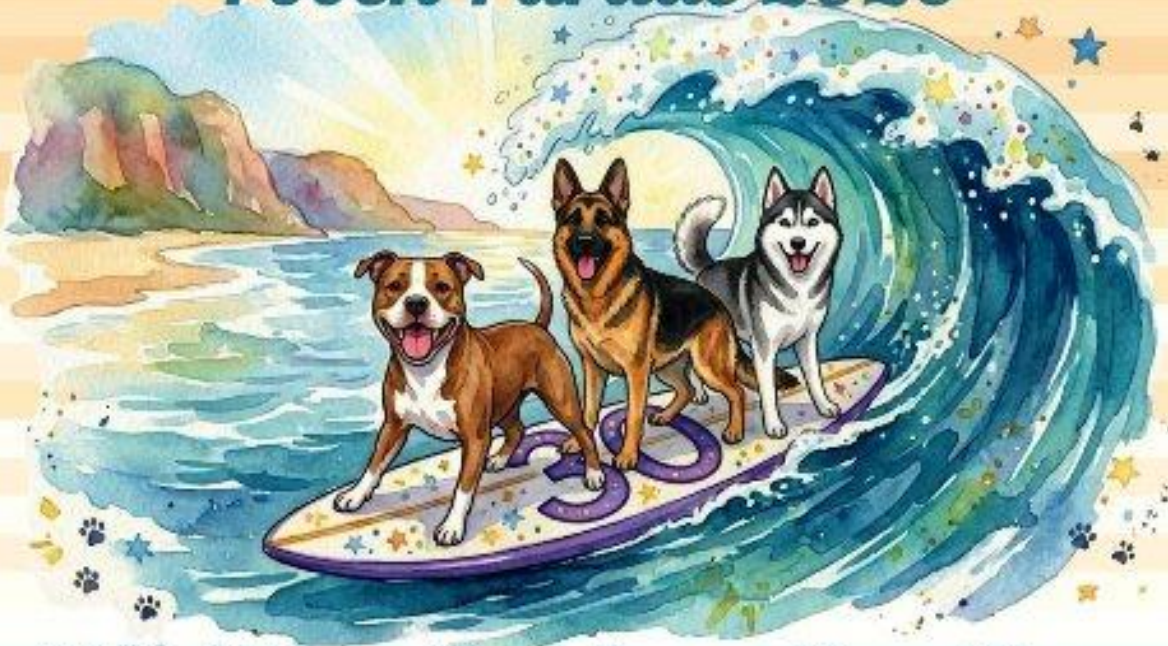

HORSE QUIZ

The horse has served man well in various roles -- in war, hunting and sport. They also figure prominently in mythology and literature.

Take this quiz and learn more about these magnificent creatures.

Q: What is a centaur?

A: In Greek mythology the centaur was a creature with the upper torso of a man and the body and legs of a horse.

Q: What is the best known horse in literature?

A: Black Beauty by Anna Sewell.

Q: What is a species of Wild Horse?

A: Nicolai Przewalski found the only species of wild horse in Central Asia in 1881 and so it was named Przewalski's horse. The Mustang of Wild West fame is descended from domesticated horses that escaped.

Q: What was Pegasus?

A: Pegasus is one of the best known creatures in Greek mythology. He is a winged divine stallion usually depicted as pure white in color. He was sired by Poseidon, in his role as horse-god, and foaled by the Gorgon Medusa.

Q: To what use is horse hair put?

A: The hair from the mane and tail is or was used for stuffing furniture.

Evolution & History

Ancient Origins:

The earliest ancestor of the modern horse, the *Eohippus*, was a small, dog-sized creature that roamed the earth about 55 million years ago.

Breed Diversity:

All domestic horses belong to a single subspecies (*Equus ferus caballus*), but there are over 400 distinct breeds globally.

First Uses:

Early civilizations utilized horses for their meat and milk, but their domestication quickly revolutionized human society by providing a massive leap forward in transportation, trade, herding, and warfare.

FACTS ABOUT HORSE'S EYES



- Nearly 360° field of vision
- They have 2 blind spots.
 - Directly in front of their face
 - 6ft behind their tails.
- They see mostly with one eye at a time. This is why they can spook at something they just walked by. They are now seeing it for the first time with their other eye.
- Their top field of vision is for seeing at a distance and their lower field of vision is for seeing up close. So they move their heads up & down to adjust for that.
- The largest land mammal eye. Only whales, seals & ostriches have larger eyes.
- Depth perception is different since they mostly see with one eye at a time.
- They have Great night vision. Even better than cats!
- Sensory hairs around their eyes alert them to possible eye-damaging objects. Do not trim these hairs, they need them!

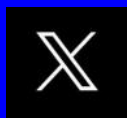
