The Kennedy's Personal Pets

Many US presidents and their families have had White House pets, and over the years dogs have been central to this unofficial tradition. John F. and Jacqueline Kennedy embraced the presence of pets in the presidential home wholeheartedly during his two and a half year time in office. Among rabbits, horses, cats, hamsters and parakeets, the family had the following dogs: Gaullie, a poodle; Charlie, Welsh terrier; Moe, doberman pinscher; Pushinka, a gift from Khrushchev whose parent was Soviet space dog Strelka; Shannon, Irish cocker spaniel; Wolf, an Irish wolfhound schnauzer cross; Clipper, German shepherd; and four puppies by Pushinka and Charlie named Butterfly, White Tips, Blackie and Streaker.

*The main purpose of a male peacock's tail feathers is a mating display. The colorful feathers, called a train, are used mainly to attract female peahens during courtship.

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COMMUNITY DOG PARKS

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

Arroyo Burro Beach Park

Located at 2981 Cliff Drive, this county park is the portal for the best known off-leash spot in the Santa Barbara area. Dogs are required to be on leash through the parking lot and bathing beach until, passing Arroyo Burro Slough, dogs are welcome to run free and cavort in the Pacific Ocean surf below the city's Douglas Family Preserve. Self service dog wash stations provided by County Parks.

Hours: Daily from 8:00am - Dusk

TUCKERS GROVE PARK

Newly fenced off-leash area at Kiwanis Meadow is now open. The new play area is at the eastern end of the park, and is near ample parking and a public restroom. This area also provides easy access to the San Antonio Creek Trail, a mostly shaded 1.5-mile route that heads northeasterly to a trailhead at CA Route 154. Tucker's Grove County Park is located at intersection of Turnpike and Cathedral Oaks Roads.

TORO CANYON PARK

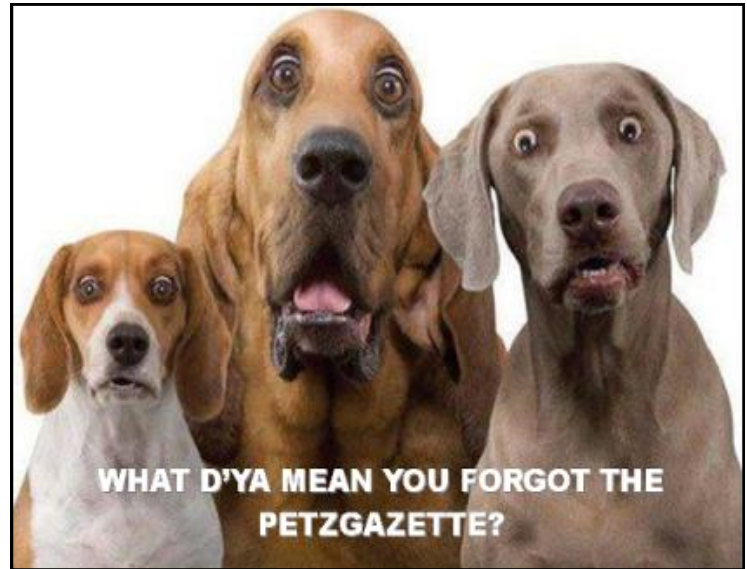

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September is a month marked by significant historical events. Notable occurrences include the end of World War II in the Pacific with the declaration of VJ Day on September 2nd, 1945 by President Truman. The discovery of the Titanic's wreckage by Robert Ballard, and the September 11th, 2001 terrorist attacks in the United States.

How to Help Prevent Foxtail Problems

- ▶ Avoid foxtail-infested areas in “foxtail season” – from early summer, when foxtails and surrounding grasses start to dry, until the fall or winter wet season eliminates the foxtail threat.
- ▶ If you must walk your dog in areas where foxtails grow, keep him on leash and on the trail to help reduce his chances of encountering the awns.
- ▶ To keep your dog from inhaling or ingesting a foxtail awn, don't allow him to play fetch anywhere near foxtails. Don't allow hunting or tracking dogs to sniff around foxtails.
- ▶ If you have foxtails in your yard, keep the plants mowed while they are still green to help prevent them from going to seed. Better yet, pull the grasses up by hand and deposit the whole plants directly into a garbage bag or compost bin.
- ▶ If your dog is long-haired, trim all the hair between his toes, over the top of his toes and feet, from his legs, around his ears, his vent, and his belly. Short hair helps deny the foxtails the resistance they need to migrate deeper into the dog's skin.
- ▶ Keep your dog well groomed. Foxtails readily work their way into mats, but can be easily brushed out of a

clean, untangled coat.

- ▶ Most importantly, after every outdoor experience in a foxtail zone, check your dog from head to toe. Examine the space between each and every toe and underneath his feet. Look in his armpits, groin, anal area, and ears.
- ▶ Keep alert for suspicious lumps, bumps, or swellings on your dog. Look for limping or excessive licking of toes, head-shaking, sneezing, or a glued-shut eye.
- ▶ If your dog exhibits any of the symptoms of having a foxtail (see sidebar, previous page), take him to a veterinarian as soon as possible – that day!

Other animals like foxes, hedgehogs, and geese are also linked to this season, preparing for winter through various activities such as growing thicker fur, hibernating, or migrating.

Visiting an orchard or pumpkin patch is a quintessential autumn activity. These places are not just about picking pumpkins or apples; they offer a whole day of fun with activities like hayrides, corn mazes, and petting zoos.

Animals do not usually complete their hibernation in autumn, but many start the process during these cooler months. As temperatures drop and food becomes hard to find, animals like dormice and queen bumblebees look for safe places, build nests, and enter a deep sleep that lasts through the winter.

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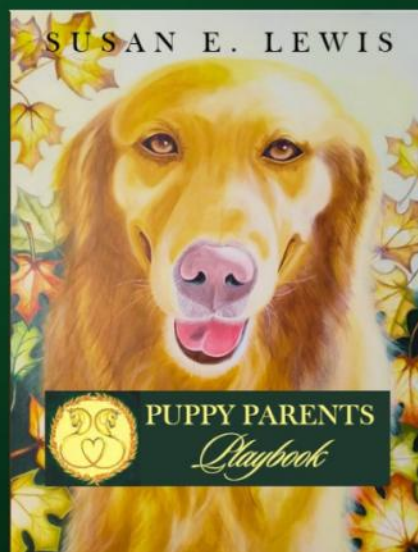
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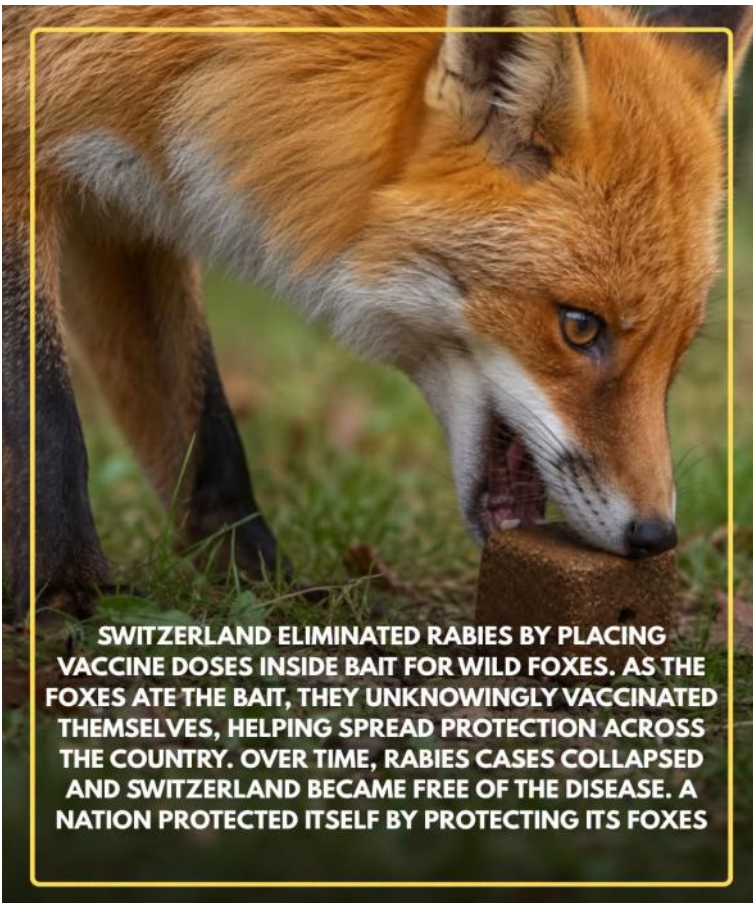
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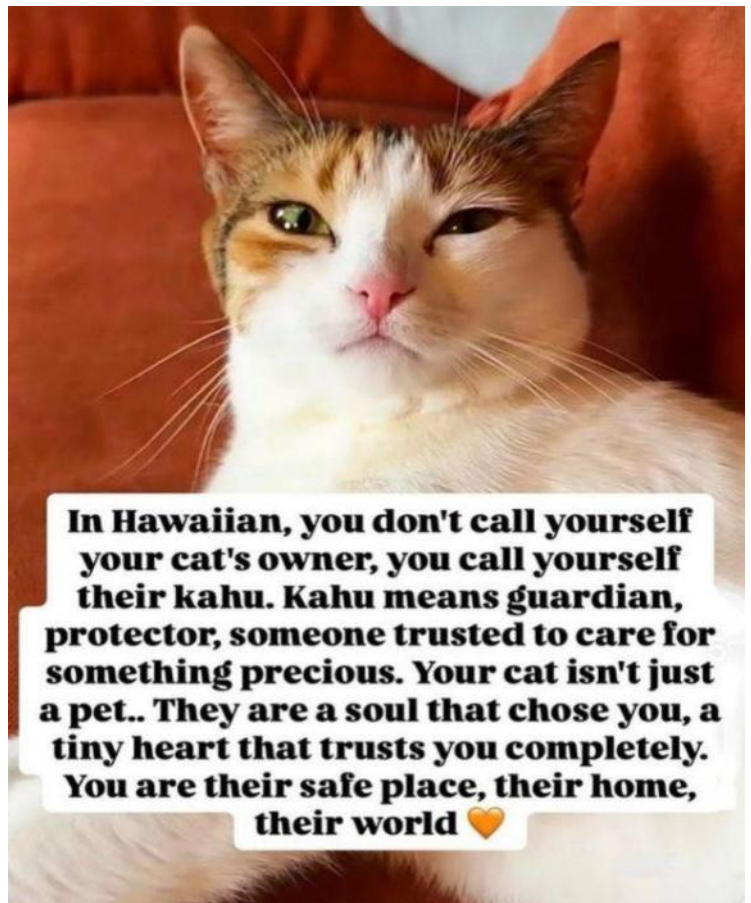

- 1 tablespoon water, as needed

- Mix pumpkin, oat flour, flaxseed, and sunflower seed butter into a soft dough.
- Add a little water if needed.

- Bake 18-22 minutes until firm.
- Cool completely before serving.

What to Do in an Emergency

If you see an animal in distress inside a hot vehicle, take action immediately:

Note the Details: Write down the vehicle's make, model, color, and license plate number.

Find the Owner: If you are near a store, ask management to page the license plate over the intercom.

Call for Help: Immediately call local law enforcement 911 (such as the Ventura County Sheriff's Dept) or animal control. In California, trained emergency responders can legally remove an animal from a vehicle to protect its health and safety.

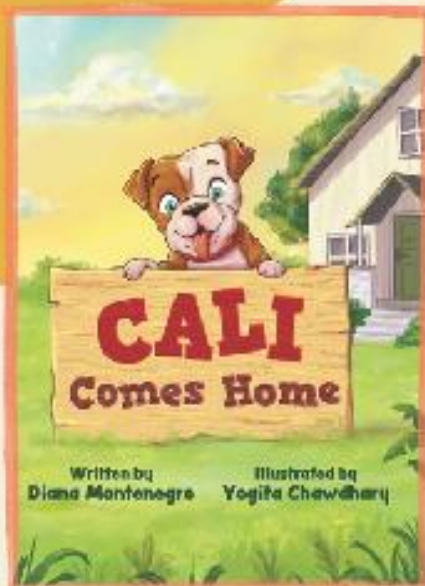

Horse Trivia

- The tallest horse on record was a Shire named 'Samson'. He was 21.2 hands (7 feet, 2 inches) tall. He was born in 1846 in Todington Mills, England.
- If a horse's eye tears excessively the problem may be a nasolacrimal duct that is blocked by debris, inflammation, or scar tissue, or that has been damaged.
- Scientists believe that the first known ancestor of the horse lived about 50 million years ago. This prehistoric horse is called Eohippus and had four padded toes on the front legs and three padded toes on the back legs. Eo means "dawn" and hipus means "horse," so Eohippus is "dawn horse."
- A horse's splint bones are thought to be remnants of toes from prehistoric horses. The splint bones are small bones (about the size of a pencil at the top and tapering down to be much smaller) found on each side of the cannon bone.

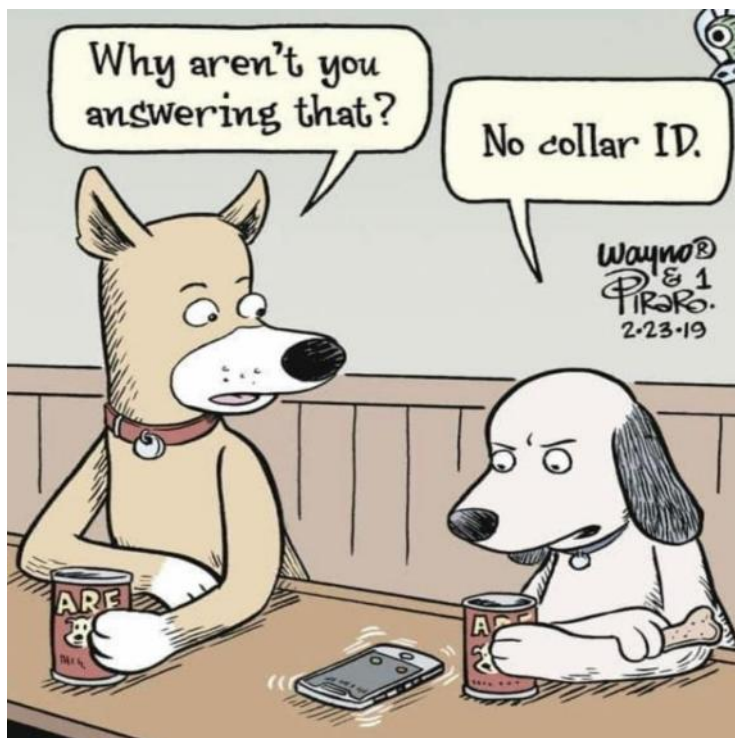

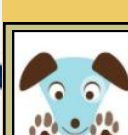
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CAN PEACOCKS FLY?

Yes, peacocks can fly. Despite their large size and long, heavy trains, peacocks use powerful wings to fly short distances, usually to escape predators or fly up to trees and rooftops to roost at night. They are surprisingly agile and can achieve vertical takeoff, though they spend most of their time on the ground.

Key facts about peacock flight:

- **Roosting & Safety:** They often fly up to high branches or roofs (3–4 meters) to sleep securely at night.

Flight Ability:

Their long, ornate tail feathers do not significantly hinder their ability to take off or fly.

- **Short Bursts:** They typically only fly for short distances, as they are heavy birds, but they are capable of flying distances under 1 mile.

Not Soaring Birds: They do not fly long distances or soar like hawks; their flight is more of a quick, powered ascent.

HISTORY OF THE PEACOCK (Peafowls)

Peafowl, native to India and Sri Lanka, have been admired for over 3,000 years, symbolizing royalty, immortality, and divinity across cultures. Revered in Hindu, Greek, and Christian traditions, they were imported by ancient civilizations to the Middle East and Europe. Historically, they were treated as royal pets and ornamental, often depicted in art and in modern branding like the 11-feathered NBC logo created in 1956.

Historical Significance and Symbolism

- **Indian Heritage:** Peafowl are deeply rooted in Indian culture, where they are native and recognized as the national bird. The Hindu god Kartikeya is often depicted riding a peacock

- **Ancient Greece & Rome:** In Greek mythology, they were associated with Hera, queen of the gods, and seen as symbols of immortality. Romans valued them as a delicacy, often serving them at banquets.

- **Biblical Times:** Peacocks are mentioned in the Bible as treasures brought to King Solomon.

Religious Symbolism: In early Christianity, the peacock was adopted as a symbol of immortality and resurrection. In Yazidism, Tawûsî Melek, the "Peacock Angel," is a central figure.

Spread and Cultural Impact

- **Alexander the Great:** He is credited with introducing them to Greece and forbidding their destruction after seeing them in India.

- **Middle Ages & Renaissance:** Peafowl were kept in European gardens as signs of luxury and status. Their image was frequently used in heraldry and art.

Modern Day: They remain popular in parks and zoos worldwide and serve as symbols in modern branding.

Interesting Facts

- **"In His Pride":** A term used in heraldry to describe a peacock with its tail displayed.

- **Misunderstood Creature:** Cardinal Wolsey in 1526 had English judges decide whether they were wild or domestic, resulting in their classification as domestic fowl.

"Peacocking": A term denoting pride or, in some contexts (like in Australia), the practice of purchasing specific land to render surrounding areas less valuable.
